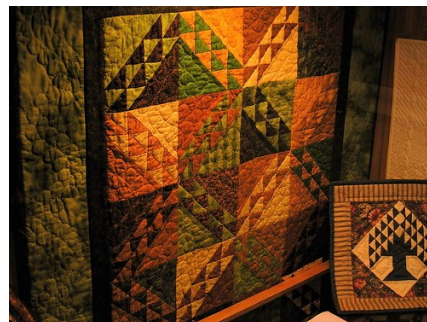

NNQS Committee Meeting Oct 24 2024

Debbie Gamm called the meeting to order and announced that she has check request/deposit forms if needed. Vicki Nagayama, Treasurer, is out of town but should have a financial report by the November guild meetings.

Pam Peugh and Vicki Stanley reported that the Silent Auction made \$1719, which was presented to A Turning Point.

Judy LaVeer reported that the bazaar preliminary report indicated they made just over \$5000, well over their budgeted expectations of \$3500. Judy and Jean Newton discussed where they donated the leftover goods from the bazaar, and what they might do next time around. Hillcrest Church, the St. Luke's Sewing Room, and the Sewing Lab accepted donated goods. The Committee complimented Judy and Jean on how well organized and successful the bazaar was. Judy may do the bazaar again. We may possibly sell goods at a table at the Hillside Quilt-R's and Craft-R's Market in August 2025 as well.

Jean Newton recommended that we have a core committee formed in advance of the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival so that we could approach vendors, etc. The Committee discussed the frequency of meetings needed in 2025 and concluded that once in the spring and once in the fall should be sufficient to make sure annual bills get paid and long-range preparations are made.

Alycia Woodman and Debbie Gamm recommended that we hire people to load and unload trucks for the show in 2026, as some of the show materials are too heavy for us and the work is increasingly unsafe. Movers insured against injury/liability would be best. We also learned of a possible option to rent storage space from the church; Debbie Gamm will follow up on this. It may serve as a bazaar storage and staging space, for example.

The Committee discussed whether we needed the guilds to agree to participate in the Hillside Market and decided that this is a Show decision to be made by the NNQS Committee. We would sell primarily fabric (no scrap bags), some notions, and some patterns.

The next meeting of the NNQS Committee will be March 27, 2025 at 6 pm at the Gashland Methodist Church. Meeting adjourned.

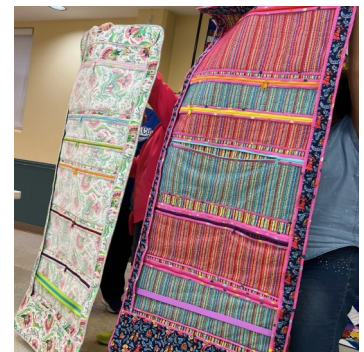
