



Labels and sleeves are nice but not required. See Roberta or Trudy Coogan for forms or see the January newsletter.
- 2. Judged quilts: forms available online March 1. 100 quilts accepted. You are solely responsible for judged quilts. Non-cash prizes are awarded. See the forms for details. You are responsible for delivery and pick up of your entry.
- 3. Tickets and merchandise: Roberta and I will take orders for tickets and merchandise in March, April and May. We will be available at 9 AM to take orders and money. If you order in March we will deliver at the May meeting. If you order in April we MAY have stuff for you at the May guild meeting. If you order in May, pick up your stuff at the KCRQF Festival booth at the Convention center. Cash or check only. We cannot process credit cards. If you order, please be available to pick up your tickets and merchandise. We will NOT hunt you down. We will NOT deliver to your home. Pick up at guild or SewBee. Check online for available merchandise, including a carry sack, t shirt, pin, other.
- 4. Volunteers are needed. We need 26 volunteers over the 3 days to serve as vendor ambassadors. Pick up a walkie talkie, visit the booths in your assigned area and ask if they need anything. The charity this year is *Never Alone*. It is an outreach organization for homeless and low-income families. The organization provides a weekly meal, clothes, school supplies and back packs for the kids. They also have a weekly Bible Study.

Set Up/Take Down- Vicki Nagayama passed out the floor plan of the Hillside Christian Church and went over where everyone will be setting up. There is still a question as to where the Opportunity Quilts and Charity information will be set up. There was also a discussion about where Admissions would be positioned.

Discussion about Quilt forms and Registration was tabled for a later date. There was also a discussion as to whether all hand quilted quilts should be grouped together, specifically, large and small quilts, lap quilts and wall hangings.

Publicity- Barbara Moyer has ordered 500 business cards to be split between the two guilds. One thousand 'Save the Date' cards have been ordered at the cost of \$10. She will order another 2500. Notice of the quilt show has been placed in the Directory and Country Register of Missouri

All agreed that a quarter page ad would be placed in the KCRQF Booklet advertising our quilt show in September. The cost is \$250. Phyllis Carlyle will be taking care of the Logo and signs.

Bazaar- Celeste Wegner didn't have anything for this meeting. However, she will need to get supplies from storage sometime soon and will contact Vicki to arrange a time to meet there.

Ads/Sponsors- Pam Peugh and Joy Behrens: Joy announced that the forms in Dropbox have not been updated. Trish told Joy that we would work to get the forms updated. Joy also asked that there be a page in the booklet to recognize a favorite or pass quilter. The cost for the space would be \$10. Joy will put together an example for the next meeting.

Admissions- Trudy Coogan didn't have anything for this meeting. The position from the Nitetime Needlers has not been filled.

Miscellaneous- Trudy Coogan asked if anyone looked at or read the KCRQF Frontlines monthly newsletter. She asked if information about the quilt show should be put in the April and May newsletter. It was agreed that our quilt show information should be included in the April and May newsletter.

Ribbons – It was asked about a "Pastor's Choice" ribbon this year. The thought was that the Pastor of Hillside Christian Church should be asked first, before making the ribbon.

Joy Behrens will be purchasing 50 to 100 yards of black polyester fabric, 72" to 108" wide on her trip to California. She has been authorized to spend up to \$200.

The next Quilt Show meeting will be April 25, 2019 at 6:30 pm at Hillside Christian Church, 900 NE Vivion Road, Kansas City, MO.
