NNQS Minutes 7 25 2024

Debbie Gamm called the meeting to order.

Karen Allen moved, Roberta Waterfield seconded and the members approved the minutes of the previous meeting.

Vicki Nagayama called for outstanding expense requests, and reported that a Treasurer's Report would be forthcoming in the guild newsletters now that expenses are coming in.

Old Business:

Facebook: Jean Newton and Vicki Nagayama are now administrators on the show Facebook page and will add Karen Allen. We still have multiple accounts out there that are apparently impossible to remove.

Committee Reports:

Bazaar—Jean Newton reported that the last official collection will be at the August meeting; if we need to deliver more after that we must contact Judy Laveer. September 4 will be the last bazaar work day.

Publicity—Sandy Cerra will get Save the Date cards out to members by the next guild meetings. Committee members suggested other ways to advertise the show.

Quilt Registration—Vicki Nagayama says only forty-something quilts are registered so far. Another email blast went out to remind people how to register their quilts for the show.

Signs—Phyllis Carlyle collected information for new signs for the show, and announced that she will be out of town for the August committee meeting. She needs all sign information by August 10. If the dates for our 2026 show are confirmed in time, she will make a Save the Date sign for the show with those dates; otherwise the sign will say that our next show will be in September 2026. Silent Auction—Pam Peugh stated that she will continue to accept items until the date of the show. Vicki Stanley reported that she will have flyers at the Silent Auction to tell people about our sponsored charity, A Turning Point.

Special Exhibit—Roberta Waterfield has thirty quilts signed up but could accept as many as eighty in the display space she has.

Sponsors – Pam Peugh reported that we have three confirmed and she will try for two more.

Vendors—Marci Hainkel was absent, but sent word that she has four vendors confirmed.

Website Coordinator—Brandi Webb was absent, but Vicki Nagayama reported that the show web site NNQS.webs.com is down and they have been unable to resolve this so far. The host site has been bought out a couple of times so it is difficult to determine what happened to our site access.

New Business: Pam Peugh suggested that the quilt labels for sponsored quilts make the quilt maker's name more prominent than the sponsor. Vicki Nagayama explained how the labels are generated from the registration forms with a mail merge into a Word document that can be edited. She will try to find a way to automate the process of making the quilt maker's name more prominent, but may have to do it manually and would appreciate a reminder to do that.

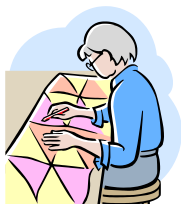
