Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival 2023

It's starting to heat up for the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival! The dates are June 15th, 16th, and 17th, 2023 at the Overland Park Convention Center, Overland Park, Kansas.

Starting **February 15th through March 14th** you will be able to sign-up for the Door Prizes job only. Beginning March 15th, sign-ups will be opened up to all members of all the guilds to fill the time slots for the other jobs. Please remember, as a participating guild of the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival, ALL members of the guilds are asked to volunteer in some capacity. Hopefully before March 15th, I will have the job descriptions for all the jobs that will need to be filled to help you decide where you would like to sign up.

Also starting March 1, 2023 we will begin registering our guild's quilts that will be on display during the Festival. PLEASE consider hanging your quilt at the Festival. Quilts must have no side smaller than 24 inches and no side larger than 96". All quilts must be machine or hand quilted with the exception of traditional Crazy Quilts which may be tied. Quilts must also have a 4" sleeve and a label. The label must have the name of the quilt, the entrant's name, address and phone number. For more information go to the KCRQF website under the Home Tab – About Us – 2023 Guild Quilt Entries. The deadline for registration is March 31st. A registration form will be in the February Newsletter.

The Festival will not be providing scooters/wheelchairs. If anyone is in need of a scooter or wheelchair for the Festival, you can contact Chuck's Mobility to make those arrangements yourself.
