#### Minutes of General Meeting



The meeting was called to order by Donna Brattin, President. She welcomed members and asked if there were any visitors. There were nine visitors today.

**Membership**: Nancy Bellis – There were 76 members present. There are currently 134 guild members. Four people joined today.

**Minutes/Treasurer's Report**: The Treasurer's report and Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Old Business: - There are three new mini groups that are getting started this year. The type of group and facilitators are: Wool – Helen Tidics, Table Runners – Roberta Waterfield and Panels – Donna Brattin. Anyone interested in one of these groups should contact the facilitator. There is some interest in a Crazy Quilt group; if anyone is interested in facilitating this group, contact Donna Brattin.

**New Business:** Two individuals who were absent from the December meeting were installed as officers for 2019: Rita Fenn, Secretary and Michele Midtbo, Treasurer.

Donna mentioned that we have received contribution solicitations from Wounded Warriors and the Salvation Army and did not know our history with this. It was clarified that historically we have only made contributions as a special donations in recognition of someone such as memorial gifts.

**Opportunity Quilt**: llene Ankenman – The pattern for the 2019 Opportunity Quilt has been selected and helpers have been recruited. This is a fund raiser for our Guild programs and each member is asked to sell 20 tickets.

**Quilt Show**: Trish Rogers – Trish was absent but it was reported that a contract has been signed to host our 2019 Quilt Show at Hillside Christian Church. The Wednesday prior, items may be moved into the church but set up will begin the following day. Dates for the show are September 20 and 21. The first Quilt Show meeting will be held Thursday, February 28 at 6:30 where our monthly meetings are held. A secretary is still needed for the quilt show. Other openings were listed in a January 9 email to members.

**Quilted Blessings**: Teddie Broughton – Last year 80 donation quilts were distributed. It is preferred that donation quilts be quilted but are still accepted if you are not able to quilt it. Donations are given to Baby Grace, North Care Hospice and nursing homes.



#### Did You Know?

As a follow up to discussion at our January Guild meeting, the following clarification is provided.

The Northland Needlers Quilt Show is a joint activity of the Northland Quilt Guild and the Nitetime Needlers Quilt Guild. All income and expenses from the Northland Needlers Quilt Show are handled in a separate bank account and only benefit the two guilds if the account balance reaches \$10,000 at which time the overage is repaid to each guild. Money to support the Quilt Show comes mostly from Vendor fees, Sponsors, Admissions and the Boutique.
