Minutes of General Meeting January 9, 2020

Membership: Mary Carson announced that there were 87 members present including 7 new members. She collected 97 membership forms and payments by the end of the meeting.

Minutes/Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report and minutes from the December meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

New Business: Becky reported that she purchased Office 360 for \$99 for guild use. It has the capacity for five users. Becky is using one and membership is using one. Three are still available for committee chairs needing it. It was moved and seconded that Becky be reimbursed \$99 for the purchase.



Peer to Peer

I am excited to announce that our first Peer to Peer class has been scheduled and it will be held right after the March Guild Meeting. Our own Teddie Broughton will be teaching how to make her Jelly Roll Rugs! If you would like to take this class please make sure you sign up so that we know how many will be attending. Please contact me if you have any questions or wish to sign up. Here is what you need to know before March!

Supplies

1 jelly roll (40-42 2 1/2" x 42" x strips)

Jeans sewing machine needle

1 large spool of thread

4-5 bobbins prewound

Best Press or other starch

Walking foot for your machine

Batting strips that are cut into 2 1/2" wide (I will bring some batting scraps that you can cut if you want to)

Before the first class you will need to sew the fabric strips together by mitering, then trim the strips and press the seams open. This strip will be about 50 yards long. Accordion fold the strip at about 12" increments. Tie loosely at each end near the folds with a strip of fabric. Place in a paper bag.

We will start placing the batting in the strips on the first day and rolling it into a ball. If we don't finish you may finish this step at home.
