SEWING BEE



Mini Quilts for Charity

- Size no larger than 24" x 24"
- Guilds must submit at least 1 mini but prefer more. Hope to get 200 mini quilts.
- ALL minis must be submitted by the April 20, 2019 Festival meeting.
- Makers may put a label on, but it is not required.
- Makers may put a hanging sleeve on, but it is not required.
- Makers must provide the minimum bid price and the "buy it now" price. If
 committee feels the price is not consistent with other minis, the committee has
 the right to change it, up or down.
- If mini does not sell, it goes back to the guild that submitted it.
- Minis that are sold and the buyer is not present on Saturday, June 15, 2019, then
 once payment is received (including the postage amount), the quilt will be mailed
 to them.
- Maker should submit a bio with information on the maker, inspiration, pattern name, etc. to go with the purchased mini; however, it is not required.
- Mini may be made with any technique, pieced, applique, paper pieced, etc.
