Quilt Show: Trish Rogers – Quilt registration forms for our guild's quilt show are due at our July meeting. The forms were in the June newsletter and some were available at today's meeting. Members are limited to entering four quilts. Sign up sheets for volunteering at our show are at each meeting. Joy Beherns purchases 140 yards of 60" black fabric for the quilt show drapes. Volunteers are needed to help sew the drapes or to be in charge of getting them sewn. Fabric will be at this month's Sewing Bee. Joy Behrens, who is working on program sponsors and prizes for our quilt show, announced that we are in need of prizes and advertising. She requested that members to help solicit advertising and prizes from personal contacts. Our guild is still in need of someone to take responsibility for the "safekeeping" of our small quilt special exhibit of "Men and Women of Missouri." The Mid -Continent Genealogy Library Center in Independence is interested in using this exhibit in 2021 for the Missouri Bicentennial.



The meeting was called to order by Patricia Rogers at 6:30pm at Gashland United Methodist Church.

Admissions- Trudy Coogan: The position for admissions co-chair from Nitetime Needlers is still open. Trudy asked for volunteers, particularly from Nite guild to sign up to help on Saturday.

Ads/Sponsors- Pam Peugh and Joy Behrens: Joy reported that ads are coming in and there are several sponsors, namely; Prairie Point and Quilter's Station. Gwen Weakley asked that the ads/business cards be sent to her through email as a ".jpg" file for the program booklet.

Bazaar- Celeste Wegner: Celeste has a floor plan and needed two additional tables, which she received. She really needs more volunteers to help with pricing, ironing of fabric and getting the items ready for the Bazaar. The schedule will be in the newsletters.

Judges- Jane Bromberg: Jane reported that she has three judges; Linnca Stevens, Jenifer Dick and Lori Triplett. Their Judges Agreements and bios have been put in Dropbox. The judging will begin at 1:00 pm.

2020 Logo- Barbara Moyer, Phyllis Carlyle – There was much discussion about the logo options. Phyllis will create another sample of the 2020 Logo using the window with a sunburst, in sunset colors, in the background.

Publicity- Barbara Moyer, Brenda Pfannestiel: Barbara has "Save the Date" cards leftover from the Regional Quilt Festival. She will distribute around to area quilt shops. She will have "Save the Date" cards with next year's logo and dates printed for the September quilt show.

Quilt Show Booklet-Gwen Weakley: Gwen is working on the booklet and getting the necessary information - We need to have everything ready by the end of July

Registration Forms- July is the time to turn in those registration forms! Please complete the forms (copies were available in June), fill them in with complete information and bring them with you July 11. Trish, Jerriann and Roberta will be available at 9 a.m. at Gashland UMC and again at 6 p.m. at Hillside Christian to accept the forms. You have until September to complete the quilts but the forms are needed so they can be entered in software to be listed in the show booklet.

Ribbons- Jean Newton: Jean asked if a "Pastor's Ribbon" is needed. Jerriann Kutny said she would find out and let her know.

Set Up/Take Down-Vicki Nagayama: Vicki needed to know where the tables for lunch will be set up. Jerriann clarified with the church that we can use the end of the hall for eating and sitting as well as using the courtyard, weather permitting. The church will need 2 tables for serving food and the remaining area outside the kitchen will have tables and chairs for eating. Phyllis has a 10ft. awning available also. Vicki was authorized to spend up to \$1,000 to purchase additional needed frames and equipment. There is a 10% discount if spending \$1,000.

Signs- Phyllis Carlyle: If signs are needed, she needs the information 4-5 weeks before the show.

Silent Auction- Mona Meyers, Teddie Broughton, Carol Sparks, Marci Hanikel: Items have been donated to the daytime guild. Carol stated that she had one item, but that she would receive more at the July meeting. Carol asked about pamphlets to hand out on the charity *Never Alone*. Also, there was discussion on the "Buy It Now" signs for the handmade items and baskets. It was decided that the signs would be changed to "Bid or Buy It Now" so that there would be bidding.

Special Exhibit- Roberta Waterfield: Roberta would like next year's Special Exhibit to be Halloween themed (may add fall design options but not sure about that) and will purchase fabric early when it's available. She will use only one fabric and not limit how many others can be used. Roberta hopes to have Halloween fabric to sell to guild members who want to make special exhibit quilts.

Treasurer's Report- Shirley Green: Ginger was there to issue checks for pending invoices.

Vendors- Joann Borchelt: One vendor had to drop out. Bernina is interested in taking the spot. Joann will get in touch with them. Also, the person who has the cookbooks for sale will set-up in the entry way next to the Silent Auction area.

Miscellaneous- 1) From the black fabric that was purchased by Joy Behrens, 48 panels were cut to make a total of 24 drapes (116" x 96"). Trish typed up directions on how to make flat-fell seams and how to finish the drapes. All 24 sets of fabric were taken by sewers to be completed by September.

- 2) United Way of the Midlands is collecting quilts for flood victims and our guilds will collect quilts at the quilt show. Jerriann Kutny will deliver them to the Omaha Quilt Guild. All sizes will be accepted.
- 3) There is Wi-Fi at the church, Hillside Christian Church.
- 4) Set-up of the quilt show will begin at 8:00am on Thursday, September 19th and judges will come at 1 p.m.
- FYI Jerriann counted the parking spaces: 223 plus 10 handicap and there are 13 in the back I think we should designate as venders onl

Note: The pastor will try to get me the menu to us soon.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m. The next Quilt Show meeting will be July 25, 2019 at 6:30 pm at Gashland United Methodist Church.
