
2019 UPCOMING PROGRAMS


QUILTED BLESSINGS


Thank You!



Minutes of October 24, 2019 Quilt Show Follow-up Meeting

Attendees: Patricia Rogers, Jerriann Kutny, Gwen Weakley, Roberta Waterfield, Shirley Green, Phyllis Carlyle, Jane Bromberg, Vicki <u>Nagayama</u>, Teddie Broughton, Jo Forsythe, Trudy Coogan, Jean Newton, Brenda Pfannenstiel, Mona Meyers, Marci Hainkel, Barbara Moyer

The meeting was called to order on October 24, 2019 at 6:30pm by Patricia Rogers at Gashland United Methodist Church.

Admissions- Trudy Coogan: Admissions went well. Approximately 650 attended for both days. Trudy thought that Fridays attendees were mostly quilters. She thought Saturday was a little slower. Many purchased two day tickets at the door. For next year, only two people are needed to work the admissions table at a time. There is not room for three people.

Ads/Sponsors- Pam Peugh and Joy Behrens: Income was a little more than last year.

Bazaar- Celeste Wegner: The Bazaar made \$3,998.65 this year. Celeste has said she will not be returning next year.

Door Prizes- There were some leftover. They will be divided between the two guilds.

Frames and Equipment- Vicki Nagayama: Vicki asked for an assistant who is organized and willing to help where needed. Hopefully, no more black drapes are needed. There was discussion as to whether more 18" tables are needed for next year.

Judges- Jane Bromberg: Judges worked out well this year. This year the judging happened in the afternoon, next year it can be done in the morning since we will be able to start set-up on Wednesday night. Out of 125 quilts, there were 70 quilts judged. Jane reported that she keeps track of the percentage of how many quilts are judged to be sure that what the judges are paid for their time averages out.

Publicity- Barbara Moyer, Brenda Pfannenstiel – Barbara Moyer reported that more was spent on publicity than last year, however, she was still under budget. Brenda Pfannenstiel will be returning next year to handle publicity.

Quilt Show Audit- The quilt show need to be audited by January 20, 2020. The President of each guild will appoint two members to oversee the audit.

Quilt Show Booklet-Gwen Weakley: Out of the 600 booklets there is one partial box left. The booklet had the same number of pages as last year and the cost to print was the same.

Registration- The registration form has been revised for next year. We will pass the new form out at February meeting and discuss revisions to the instructions for more specific details for clarity.

Minutes of October 24, 2019 Quilt Show Follow-up Meeting

Page Two

Quilt Registration & Entry- Vicki Nagayama, Gwen Weakley, Patricia Rogers – There were some problems with the description cards on the quilts. Vicki took responsibility and assured that it wouldn't happen again.

Ribbons- Jean Newton: Jean will make ribbons again for next year and will make some extra in case of a tie. Two of the three extras she made were used this year.

Signs- Phyllis Carlyle: The new logo for the Northland Needlers Quilt Show is in place for Northland Needlers Quilt Show contracts and anything that has to do with the show. Beginning in 2021, there will no longer be a separate "logo design" for the quilt show. She spent \$263. She already has had some request for signs for next year. If you think of a sign that is needed, let her know.

Silent Auction- Mona Meyers, Teddie Broughton, Carol Sparks, Marci Hainkel: The Silent Auction raised \$1,581 for the charity *Never Alone*. The money was given to Vickie McGuffin, who is now in charge of the organization. Mona Meyers reported the results of the auction and among the co-chairs it was agreed that there would not be theme baskets at next year's auction.

Special Exhibit- Roberta Waterfield: Roberta reported that some people had trouble finding the special exhibit. She is planning to make a 4' x 6' banner to hang on the outside (on the black drapes) of the exhibit to make it more visible.

Treasurer's Report- Shirley Green: Income from the Quilt show was \$13,620.85, expenses was \$8,915.43. The By-laws state that the quilt show will retain \$10,000 and the remaining balance will be divided between the two guilds, \$3,620.85.

Vendors- Joann Borchelt, Jo Forsythe: Jo Forsythe reported that all the vendors liked their space. Ten of the 13 have already signed up for next year. Will put some black drapes/frames around one vendor as she was out in the middle of the room or rearrange the placement of the tables. There was discussion about wheelchair access – some had difficulty getting into the vendor booths in the main room

Miscellaneous- 1) There was discussion about purchasing Square to be used in the Bazaar. A motion was made and seconded to investigate before the next quilt show meeting in February 2020. **2**) Brenda Pfannenstiel suggested that there be a training session for volunteers who sign up to help with the various jobs for the quilt show. **3**) Trudy Coogan suggested that we contact the person at Liberty North High School in April to get volunteers to help with moving supplies, frames, etc. from storage to the quilt show site and to help set-up, take down and be white glovers. **4**) There will be a change to the Quilt Show By-laws to reflect that someone other than the Quilt Show Secretary will make sure that Dropbox has been set-up properly. **5**) Daphne McClure and Denise Dodd have agreed to provide a lunch for the workers on set-up day.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m. The next Quilt Show meeting will be February 27, 2020 at 6:30 pm at Gashland United Methodist Church.
