

Quilt Show September 2021 Update

We had beautiful weather for our quilt show and lots of happy quilters and friends that showed up for our quilt show. We will not have the official information until the October wrap up meeting on Oct. 28 at Gashland Methodist on N Oak at 6:30 pm. All Members of both guilds are always welcome to Quilt Show meetings.

Even though we do not have the final financials, here are some of the show highlights:

As of Saturday afternoon, we had made enough revenue in admissions and the bazaar to cover our 2 largest expenses – rental of the church and rental on the storage locker for the next year.

While Friday morning was very busy and Saturday morning steady, attendance was very slow at the end of both days. Although we don't have a headcount and even with the lower attendance, our vendors were very pleased with their sales and many signed up for next year. Additionally, the Silent auction did very well and sold a lot of items at buy it now prices and both opportunity guilts did ok.

The truck rental made load in and load out (except for a minor kerffufful with the ignition on the load in) much easier with only 1 trip to and from the storage unit. At a cost of about \$350, we think it was a success and should be planned in the budget going forward.

Expenses that were surprising or eliminated this year were:

Program book approx \$600 and no seemed to miss it

No tea room and Set up food service – these are really nice to haves, but again we seemed to be ok without them.

Paid Judges approx \$450 – we were ok with just having View's Choice and Pastor's choice, but this may merit further discussion regarding if members want judging feedback, the # of judges and the cost.

There will be additional information discussed about the future of the Northland Needlers Quilt Show at the wrap up meeting and by the 2 guilds. Please plan on participating in those discussions.

2021 Quilt Show Wrap Up Meeting

Minutes

Gwen called the meeting to order at 6:36 pm.

The co-chairs for 2022 show are Joann Thomas and Debbie Davidson.

The assistant co-chair for NQG is Leah Stanley. The assistant co-chair for NNQG is yet to be determined.

Co-Chair Reports-Gwen Weakley and Trudy Coogan

Gwen and Trudy reported that the 2021 was very successful despite the obstacles of a pandemic and postponing from last year; good attendance, great sales in the bazaar and happy vendors.

Trudy recommended that in 2022 that the Key Club not be contacted to help move items to the show on set-up day. The club doesn't meet before the date of the show to get volunteers signed up. Renting a truck makes the process easier and hopefully there will be enough volunteers from the guilds to help.

Gwen stated that one half of the committees have updated their procedures. She asked that Bazaar, Quilt Registration, Set Up, Silent Auction, Ribbons, Quilt Release committees to update their procedures. The Treasurer will also write up procedures.

Gwen has given to each guild's board some points of discussion on the show going forward. Each board will review, discuss with their membership, come back and meet jointly and then propose any changes to each guild for a vote. If changes are made, then the by-laws will be amended after the vote.

Treasurer-Shirley Green and Ginger Crowley

The balance in the checking account is \$13,482.74. After keeping the stated balance in the by-laws, each guild will receive \$1566.37. The \$350 collected for vender deposits for 2022 will be reflected in next year's balance sheet. An audit will be conducted by a member of each guild. New treasurers will have to be selected for 2022.

Admissions- Mary Rohrbeck

\$2577 was taken in for admissions.

Bazaar-Karen Allen

The Bazaar was very well organized and brought in \$3951.41. This year customers were able to charge. It was well worth the \$59 equipment fee and the \$47 dollars in credit card fees to have the ability to take charge cards. The leftovers were taken to Scraps KC (510 lbs of fabric), Hillcrest Ministry, and THE ReSALE SHOP.

Door Prizes-Pam Peugh

Door prizes were plentiful. Only two were leftover. This year a membership to each guild was given as a door prize.

Frames and Equipment-Vicki Nagayama

Cross bars need to be purchased in 2022 to help stabilize the larger frames. X style bases need to stay in an X to give the frames a firm foundation.

Quilt Turn In- Gwen and Trudy

Volunteers that help with turn in need to be trained about the turn-in procedure to be helpful to the process.

Quilt Release-Jane Bromberg

Quilt release volunteers were a little disorganized. Next year there will be a better system to sort quilts for release and a meeting of all quilt release volunteers before the show ends on Saturday. Most quilts were picked-up on Saturday.

Quilt Judging and Ribbons-Jane Bromberg and Jean Newton

No judging this year by paid judges. Viewers' choice and pastor's choice were awarded.

Jean made 7 ribbons, one pastor's choice and 2 each for 1st, 2nd and 3rd viewers' choice in case of a tie.

Set Up /Tear Down-Vicki Nagayama

Set- up and take down went fine. Need better storage options for the bases, perhaps something on wheels. Maybe a color coded system to match frames and bases.

Signs and Logos-Phyllis Carlyle
