


# Hospitality

Minutes of General Meeting September 9, 2021



The meeting was called to order by president Barbara Laxson.

**Minutes/Treasurer's Report**: The Treasurer's report printed in the last newsletter was approved by the members. The minutes from the last meeting as printed in the August newsletter was approved by members.

Old Business: Donna Brattin announced that the Notable Men & Women of Missouri (an exhibit of 67 quilts put together by the Northland Quilters Day and Night quilds) is currently on display in Platte County Missouri through October 25. We need to decide what to do with the quilts following this exhibit. The Hamilton Missouri Quilt Museum has been suggested. Truman Museum was also suggested. More detailed information will be collected and presented at our October meeting for a vote.

- **10. Scrap Quilt:** Daphane McClure & Denise Dodd The scrap quilt is completed and will be on display at our quilt show.
- **11. Guild Quilt Show:** Trudy Coogan Our quilt show will be September 17 and 18. Two-day tickets are on sale today and at the door. \$7 for two days or \$5 for 1 day. Wednesday evening, they will be moving everything to the show site and Thursday will be set-up. Help can always be used for set-up and there are still volunteer openings on show days, especially Saturday.

- 13. Opportunity Quilt: JoAnn Borchelt Nothing reported. It was on display.
- **14. Quilt Show Bazaar:** Karen Allen They have received a lot of very nice item. It has not been determined if/when they will mark down items. Everything is priced very well so buy early.
- **15. KC Regional Quilt festival:** JoAnn Borchelt & Jean Hummel Jean reported that our guild received a check for \$7000 from the Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival for our guild participation this year. Our guild will need to submit a letter of intent to participate in 2023 by September 18 if we plan to participate in the 2023 festival. With our letter of intent, we can request the job of door prizes again. JoAnn Borchelt recommended that we request the same job as it was relatively easy and we now have experience with that. Terri Schroder made the motion that we participate in 2023 and the we request to handle the door prizes. The Missouri Quilt Museum is pleased to announce that the Bob Ross Cherrywood Challenge 2020 is now on display at the Missouri Quilt Museum, located in Hamilton, Missouri.

Each year Cherrywood Fabrics of Brainerd, Minnesota, conducts a challenge contest. Quilters receive a packet of fabric of the same colors and sizes. Quilters must then create a 20 x 20 inch quilt block that they feel reflects the subjects image or works. The subject of the 2020 challenge was the artist Bob Ross.

The exhibit will be on display at the museum throughout the month of September.

The Missouri Quilt Museum is located at 300 E Bird Street in Hamilton, Missouri. Museum hours are Tuesday thru Friday 11:00 AM to 5:00 PM and on Saturdays from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM.
