## NNQS Committee Meeting Aug 22 2024

Karen Allen called the meeting to order and the Treasurer's report, presented by Vicki Nagayama, was discussed.

Debbie Gamm moved, Debbie Moore seconded, and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as published in the guilds' newsletters.

### Committee Reports:

**Admissions**—would the 2-day tickets be sold at the September guild meetings or only at the door of the show? Gwen Weakley reported that she gave the 2-day tickets to someone (at the June meeting?) but couldn't remember who took them.

**Bazaar**—Judy Laveer has stopped receiving new donations, and has some materials already staged in her garage for transport to the show. Jean Newton reported on their efforts to find places to accept non-quilt fabrics left over after the show. One work day remains before the show.

**Door Prizes**-- Trudy Coogan reported that she has collected enough door prizes. \$10 gift certificates to the bazaar (two per day) will also be offered. The Committee agreed that one guild membership (annual dues for one year) would be offered from each guild at the show. Jean Newton asked if we will give vendors door prize tickets to hand out, and it was agreed that there is no reason not to.

**Publicity**—Flyers to post at local businesses and save the date cards were available. Sandy Cerra has also mailed out flyers, posted on the show Facebook page, and she got the show listed on the Heartland Quilt Network web site. Jean Newton also recommended that she get it listed on the Community Bulletin Board of local newspapers, radio, etc. Brenda Pfannenstiel has announced it on Next Door and will add it to event listings.

**Quilt Registration**—Vicki Nagayama reported that 111 quilts were registered and that this will leave five empty frames. It was agreed to give that space to Quilts in Force/Quilted Blessings displays. It was observed that a high percentage of the guild members do not register even one quilt for the show.

**Quilt Turn-In/Release**—Beth Curasi from the day guild has joined the leadership of these committees. Karen Allen washed all the pillowcases (thank you!!!) and will collect the other turn-in materials from storage to bring in on the day. Roberta Waterfield will take in the Special Exhibit quilts. Gwen Weakley observed that we have plenty of experienced people who will make the turn-in go smoothly. Debbie Gamm mentioned that quilt release procedures will be enforced; no one will "jump the line" to collect quilts without properly receiving and signing out their quilts.

**Ribbons**—Jean Newton said the ribbons are ready except for attaching the badge on the front and the pin on the back.

**Signs**—Phyllis Carlyle is absent, but has prepared all the signs.

**Silent Auction**—Pam Peugh and Vicki Stanley reported that they need help at the end of the show to distribute items.

**Special Exhibit**—Roberta Waterfield announced that she expects to have 34 quilts to exhibit.

**Sponsors**—Pam Peugh reported that she has two gold and one silver sponsor lined up.

## NNQS Committee Meeting Aug 22 2024

Vendors—Marci Hainkel is absent but has lined up six vendors, including D&K Sharpening. The Committee emphasized that they should be advertised in advance of the show, especially the sharpening vendor who will work on anything from pinking shears to gardening tools, so people will know to bring their dull edges to the show with them. Marci should be reminded to send vendor information to Sandy Cerra.

Web site coordinator—pictures of the opportunity quilts have been added to our Facebook page but we still do not have a revived show website.

Sign-Up Genius (Volunteer Coordinator)—Karen Allen announced that Joann Borchelt has put out the online Sign-Up Genius volunteer schedule, and Roberta Waterfield will take the physical sign-up sheets to the guild meetings in September. Many positions/time slots are already filled but there are more available.

New Business: Karen Allen reported that the truck has been scheduled for Wednesday and Saturday of the show week. The truck will go to Judy Laveer's house at 3:00 pm on Wednesday to pick up the bazaar materials for delivery to the church, then proceed to the storage unit to pick up the frames, etc. for staging at the church in readiness for the show set-up on Thursday. Karen wants volunteers to be at the church by 8:00 am Thursday to help set up the exhibits, bazaar, etc.

The Committee discussed how the viewer's choice ballots are tallied and agreed that all ballots must be turned in by 2:00 pm Saturday. Gwen Weakley suggested that Phyllis Carlyle be asked to make a sign for the ballot box with that deadline on it.

Roberta Waterfield confirmed with Vicki Nagayama that no additional floor cloths are needed.

Meeting adjourned.

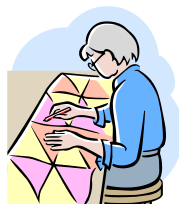
